

SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES

TAKAHARU TEZUKA

Clean lines of metal, wood and glass are the hallmarks of a Takaharu Tezuka building. Since 1994 Tezuka, wife Yui and team have designed schools based around trees, play areas made of interwoven wooded beams and hospitals which (like all of his designs) prioritise the healing properties of light and space. Walls and windows become living – and liveable – art.

DEBORAH CULLINAN

Creative urban development expert and arts advocate Deborah Cullinan heads the Yerba Buena Center for the Arts (YBCA) San Francisco's premier arts centre, built for and by the community. YBCA helped spearhead the Market Street Prototyping Festival, the inspiration for Platform.

BRUCE MUNRO

British artist Bruce Munro is best known for producing large immersive light-based installations, which often employ a massing of components by the thousands. His reoccurring motif is the use of light on an environmental scale in order to create an emotional response for the viewer. His work has been shown at the Victoria & Albert Museum, London; Waddesdon Manor, the Rothschild Collection, Buckinghamshire; and the Solomon R.Guggenheim Museum, New York.





MIKE HORNBLOW

Mike Hornblow's work is informed by performance art, dance, video, media art and philosophy. He has explored through his work cross-cultural community building through engaging and interactive creative platforms. He recently completed an Asialink Performing Arts Residency in Indonesia.

KARIM JABBARI

Karim Jabbari is considered as one of the most respected light calligraphy artists in the world, his quest for innovation and discovering new ways to incorporate the arabic calligraphy pushed him to give a new dimension to that discipline. Inspired by old arabic scriptures, and determined to establish a Contemporary approach to calligraphy, he developed his own abstract typography using different patterns, shapes, and colors. He is founder of the biggest street art festival in tunisia 'Streets Urban Festival'. Karim Jabbari was named in 2015 by the international award for public Art (IAPA) as one of the top 30 public artists in the world.

ALEX BREWER (HENSE)

Internationally recognized contemporary public artist and award-winning painter Alex Brewer, known as HENSE, has been creating colorful works of art combining techniques of graffiti and abstract painting for nearly two decades. Brewer's artworks incorporate line, shape, and gesture to creative abstract compositions that are invigorated by the quick pace and commentary of street culture. His works in the realm of public arts, grants, commissions, and crossmedia connections have landed him local, national, and international public art projects and commissions.
